Do you do your job because you have to, or because you want to? Steve Jobs, reflecting on his work at the Apple computer company, said: 'The journey is the reward'.



An Amazing People Schools success story

Meridian High School is one of London's fastest improving schools. Together with our education team, they have been developing their own Amazing People Schools Character Education programme.

The deputy head, Liz Bone, has been working with her senior leadership team on this. It was critical the staff felt it was easy to adopt.

The school has focused on a list of key characteritics that they agreed to foster within their school community. Characteristics such as courage, focus and bravery, which are



supportive of their school motto – **Motivation, Honour and Success.** These characteristics are visibly reinforced all over the school and have become part of the school's language, which Liz believes has been essential to the school's *culture shift*.


A fusion of values, behaviour and characteristics

The staff at Meridian aligned their values with the stories of Amazing People, which they then introduced to students through weekly assemblies. They knew that students were much more likely to understand and engage with the school's values when explained in the context of real life stories. The stories got students thinking in a cross-curricular way about the characteristics of amazing people who shaped our world.

Liz Bone says that the programme has really helped to drive a curiosity to learn across the school, as well as developing each student's sense of the world, their understanding of it and where they could fit into it when they leave school.

"Students can get to know amazing characters through these stories, whilst developing their own personalities and preparing for life after school." – Liz Bone, Deputy Head

To bring this full circle, the school has effectively linked their values with their "Meridian Miles" incentive scheme, so that students are rewarded when they are recognised for demonstrating an amazing characteristic. All this data has been recorded so that impact can be measured.

Student zone

Students get to explore different story worlds, which have been organised into curriculum-friendly topics.

The stories can be accessed as embedded text or audio. Avatar videos and a timeline are also included. Once a student has engaged with the story, they can test their mettle by taking an Amazing People quiz and claim their Amazing People Card, once they score 4/5 or more (we all know how motivated kids are by collecting things!).

And the great thing about the Amazing People concept is that the potential for learning from these stories is endless...

Who better understands how busy teachers are, and what they need, than teachers themselves? That's why we have worked with a core team of teachers (known as our Amazing Teachers) to create materials and Resource Sheets that support the use of Amazing People stories in schools.

The Resource Sheets can be easily incorporated during class, tutor time, assemblies or as a basis for homework or projects.



As you'll discover, we offer an entirely non-prescriptive approach, so our programme can be developed to fit each school's needs and community.

Our mission is to help schools be even more amazing and to encourage students to tap into their own amazing potential. This is an opportunity for a whole school approach to Character Education. 


THE PROACTIVE THINKING SYSTEM AND AMAZING PEOPLE

The Margerison Proactive Thinking System® (PTS) has been developed by Dr Charles Margerison and offers a framework that can be used to understand how Amazing People in history achieved success. Crucially, it offers a process that students can adopt to achieve success in their own lives.

Henry Ford, Shakespeare, James Cook, Marie Curie and many others all developed these skills. They thought in distinctive ways about the situation at hand and did something innovative, or proactive, in order to realise their dreams and ambitions. The Margerison Proactive Thinking System provides a model and framework that will enable you to understand:

- 1. The way that the life and career stories of amazing people can be a focus for issues related to the curriculum
- 2. How the Amazing People stories provide the context for lessons in science, literature, arts, music, business and other areas of the curriculum, as well as for career development purposes.
